Canada was Consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Ottawa in 1947. This year, we celebrate the 75th Anniversary of this event. The Marian Statue that was used at the time was from Canada's National Marian Shrine located at Cap de la Madeleine near Trois Rivières, Quebec. The original statue is known as Our Lady of the Cape. As a result, the Marian Devotional Movement is visiting various dioceses in Canada in 2022 as it spearheads pilgrim statue tours of Our Lady of the Cape to provide opportunities for Canadians to venerate Canada's National Madonna, to promote consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and to promote enrollment in the Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary.

A replica statue of Our Lady of the Cape will be touring our diocese from May 18 - May 20.

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They . . . reported what God had done with them. (Acts 14:27)

What's the first thing that comes into your mind when you hear the word "evangelization"? Most likely, it's not an eager anticipation to go traveling far and wide as Paul and Barnabas did. Most likely, you would not savor the prospect of undergoing the "many hardships" that these two apostles experienced as they went from town to town proclaiming the good news (Acts 14:22). Most likely, you would think, "I can't do that!"

Most likely, you'd be wrong. Because for all of Paul and Barnabas' heroics and sufferings, their effectiveness came from "*what God had done with them,*" not from their own natural abilities (Acts 14:27). Their success in one town and failure in another didn't depend on their public speaking skills or their theological knowledge. They knew that the only thing they had to share was the story of Jesus and their experience of His salvation. They left everything else to the Holy Spirit because they knew that only He could change people's hearts.

The same is true for you. Your call to become a "missionary disciple" is nothing more—and nothing less—than the call to share about your relationship with the Lord. You don't have to convince anyone. You don't have to explain all of Scripture or defend every Church teaching. In some cases, you don't even have to say anything! The witness of your life may be all that's necessary to spark in someone a greater desire to seek out the Lord for themselves.

The key is not what you say, but what God does with what you say. It's not about the forcefulness of your presentation; it's about the power of the Spirit to touch someone's heart. And that's not something you can control. The only thing you can do is speak from the heart and leave the results to the Lord.

So don't let the thought of evangelization slow you down. You have a unique story to share. Just share it!

"Come, Holy Spirit, and work through me!"
