CCCB Standing Committee for Family and Life is hosting a live and nationwide **Rosary** for the Family via Zoom.

Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most popular Catholic devotions. Although it was

beloved in previous centuries, Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1673, showing her a vision of the now-famous image of His Sacred Heart, surrounded by flames. He said to her: "My Heart is so full of love for men that It can no longer contain the flames of Its burning love. I must discover to men the treasures of My Heart and save them from perdition." She was given the special mission to spread devotion to His Sacred Heart throughout the Church.

Jesus gave St. Margaret Mary many promises associated with this devotion, and requested that a feast day in honor of His Sacred Heart be instituted on the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart was spread to the Universal Church, and in 1899 Pope Leo XIII solemnly consecrated all mankind to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, calling it "the great act" of his pontificate.

I have much more to tell you. (John 16:12)

Had Jesus run out of time? Why didn't He tell his disciples everything He had in mind? Had the Last Supper taken too long? No, Jesus' timing was always perfect. He knew His hour had come—it hadn't snuck up on Him. And He was always ready for whatever He had to do. Rather, Jesus had "much more" to teach His disciples because they weren't ready to hear it. They couldn't understand everything yet. They needed time and experience—and a lot of help from the Holy Spirit. Like those disciples, we have much more to learn. We don't quite comprehend a lot of what Jesus teaches, and we need the Spirit's help to live out the things that we do understand. Take today's feast of the Holy Trinity as a classic example. Every Sunday we proclaim that we believe in one God in three divine Persons: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But the Trinity is a mystery we will never fully comprehend. Jesus certainly has a lot He can teach us—about the Trinity and so much more. He unfolds these mysteries for us over our lifetime, as we seek Him and open ourselves to the Spirit. How blessed we are! Jesus loves to reveal His truths to us, and He offers us everything we need to understand him. He has overcome the sin that clouds our minds and hinders us from seeking and knowing God. Not only that, but He has given us the Spirit, who lives in us and helps us understand the truths of our faith. And He has given us the Church, where we receive the Scriptures, the sacraments, and brothers and sisters who love us. All these things help to reveal more and more to us about the

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. There's always more to learn from the Lord. Jesus is ready. Are you? *"Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, teach me your ways."* wau.org/dailymediation
