A Vocation View: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. When we go out to make disciples of all nations we have a lot to tell. God is Lord in heaven above and on earth below. St. Augustine of Canterbury (d. 604 A.D.), was prior of a monastery in Rome before being called by Pope Gregory the Great to be a missionary to the British Isles. The Pope received word that the pagans of Britain would embrace the faith in great numbers if priests were sent to teach them, and previous missionaries had been unsuccessful in the holy endeavor.

In order to realize the Holy Father's desire to evangelize the island, Augustine set out on a new quest at the head of forty monks in 596 A.D. When they arrived in France they heard stories of the ferocity of the Anglo-Saxons. Out of fear, Augustine returned to Rome and asked the Pope to release him from the mission. Pope Gregory encouraged Augustine in his task and sent him back.

When the monks landed in Kent they were treated kindly. The King of Kent himself accepted baptism and set up a residence for St. Augustine in Canterbury. There Augustine established a church and monastery as the center of his apostolic mission. Although his labor among the pagans was slow and difficult, his work bore much fruit and England eventually became a Christian nation.

Augustine was the first Archbishop of Canterbury, England, and is known as the "Apostle of England." His feast day is **May 27th.**



Know, and fix in your heart, that the Lord is God. (Deuteronomy 4:39)



What a beautiful reading for today's feast of the Holy Trinity! Moses' words to the Israelites tell us that there is only one God: "the Lord" (Deuteronomy 4:39). And He is a wonderful God! He is generous and kind, not like the false gods that the pagans worshipped. He is so kind, in fact, that He rescued His people from slavery and led them into the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 4:34). No pagan could say anything like that about their "god"!

Now, with the coming of Christ, we have an even greater understanding of who this one true God truly is. And at the heart of that understanding is the proclamation that our God is a Trinity of Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

As Father, He treats us with great love and calls us into His family. He welcomes us into His throne room and promises to hear us when we call to Him.

As Son, He takes on our own humanity and offers that humanity in sacrifice on a cross. And through that cross, He destroys the power of sin and showers us with mercy.

As Spirit, He pours His very life and love into us. He empowers us to live the life we've been called to—a life of love and mercy that mirrors the love of our heavenly Father.

This is our God! But we live in a world that tempts us to make false gods of riches and self-indulgence and to be indifferent to the needs of the poor. These "gods" aren't real; all they can promise are fleeting pleasures. By contrast, the one true God loves us unconditionally and wants to save us and care for us. So follow Moses' advice and "fix in your heart" the truth that you belong to God—and He belongs to you (Deuteronomy 4:39)!

"Almighty God, Father, Son, and Spirit, may You be praised and worshipped for all eternity!"

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
