Put on the new self—Rose Coleman, author *blessedissh.net*

Put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth. // Ephesians 4:22-24

I was rummaging through some family photo albums, looking for a picture I vaguely remembered. I got lost in the memories of my old self: my childhood, teenage years, college experience, young professional life, vocational discernment, and adulthood. My life has zigged and zagged in surprising ways.

The photographs contained versions of my old self. I noticed similarities and differences compared to who I am today. I remembered my strengths and weaknesses as I looked at the snapshots. The girl in the pictures is me, but she has a lot ahead of her: joys, sufferings, moves, celebrations, learning, travel, jobs, holidays, success, failures, and growth.

Saint Paul calls us to “put on the new self” (see Ephesians 4:17, 20-24). At my Baptism, my parents clothed me in white, symbolizing how I “put on Christ.” As the priest baptized me with water, the Holy Spirit purified, justified, and sanctified me. I became a beloved daughter of the Father. With each passing year, the Holy Spirit is continually calling me to deeper conversion and authentic renewal. This is not something I have to do on my own—the Holy Spirit is leading me along this path to holiness. The Holy Spirit purifies my desires and renews my mind.

If I live for several more decades, how will I look back on who I am today? Today will become a memory. Today will be my former way of life. As I gaze into the future, there is a lot ahead of me: joys, sufferings, moves, celebrations, learning, travel, jobs, holidays, success, failures, and growth. How will the Holy Spirit renew me?



Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth.

St. Maximilian Kolbe (1894–1941) was born in Poland to a devout Christian family. As a boy he had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She showed him two crowns, one white for virginity and one red for martyrdom, and asked him which he would be willing to accept. He replied that he would accept both. He later joined the Franciscans.



While studying for the priesthood in Rome, he organized a group of friars and founded the *Militia of the Immaculata* in 1917 to crusade for consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and to oppose the evil of Freemasonry. From it came the *Knights of the Immaculate* magazine that reached a circulation of 750,000, as well as a radio show, both of which became a resource for strengthening faith across Poland.

He also established a monastery which grew to 800 friars, the largest in the world at the time. In 1930 he traveled to the Far East and founded another monastery in Nagasaki, Japan. He returned to Poland in 1936.

During World War II, St. Maximilian Kolbe housed over 3,000 Polish refugees at his monastery. He was

eventually imprisoned because of his effective work, and was sent to Auschwitz in 1941. There he endured special cruelty because he was a Catholic priest. St. Maximilian ministered to the prisoners, and offered his life in place of a father who was condemned to death by firing squad. After being starved for two weeks and still found alive, he was killed by lethal injection on August 14, 1941. St. Maximilian Kolbe is the patron of families, drug addicts, prisoners, journalists, and the pro-life movement. His feast day is **August 14th**.
