To whom shall we go? (John 6:68)

This was a decisive moment for Jesus' disciples. They had seen Him perform miracles, bring people to conversion, and contend with suspicious Jewish leaders. It seemed as if He could do nothing wrong!

But now they had to make a hard decision: Would they keep following Jesus when He said something they



didn't understand? How about when they didn't like what they heard? He had just told them that He had come down from heaven and that, like God, He had the authority to grant eternal life. Then He said that anyone who wanted to follow Him had to eat His body and drink His blood. It was all too much, and most of them "no longer accompanied Him" (John 6:66).

But Peter, speaking for himself and the rest of the Twelve, cut through the confusion with one simple question: "Master, to whom shall we go?" (John 6:68). There was no one like Jesus. He truly was "the Holy One of God" (6:69). Peter couldn't let his lack of understanding derail him. He trusted that if he stayed close to Jesus, asked questions, listened carefully, and

kept an open heart, he would one day get the answers he sought. Even if it took years, he would still stick with the One whose love and grace had changed his heart so dramatically.

Do some of Jesus' words confuse you or scandalize you? Don't let them cast a shadow over everything else you have heard. Certainly don't let them cause you to doubt His love for you or for others!

Instead, draw closer to Him. Recall how patient He has been with you, and resolve to be just as patient in waiting for the answers you seek. And remember: you have the gift of faith for just this very purpose. Allow that supernatural grace to help you trust in the Lord even when you don't understand.

Jesus truly is the Holy One of God. There's nowhere else you can go to receive all that He has for you.

VOCATION CORNER –21st Sunday of the Year

A Vocation View: Jesus teaches us about life everlasting. "Your words Lord are spirit and life ..." It is this that gives us hope when we despair, a way of living when we stray from God's way. Prayer: That trusting Christ, the Word of eternal life, all men and women called to follow the Lord as priests, deacons, sisters and brothers will be faithful to His invitation, we pray to the Lord.

Action: How far are you willing to go in your own life in to bring Good News to others? Consider the example of Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne (1769-1852), born in France, travelled all the way to St. Charles, Missouri to bring the Society of the Sacred Heart religious congregation to the U.S. Today the Society has 21 schools in the U.S. and is found in 44 countries around the world. Sacred Heart sisters focus on educating young women and emphasize in their curriculum the need for global awareness and building a more just world. You can carry on these efforts in your own neighborhood, parish, office, home, and see how far the Spirit moves you.
